Storytelling helps increase a child's knowledge of the subject area whilst also encouraging creativity, expanding vocabulary, increasing attention span and reinforcing morals.

Tell us a story...

Using storytelling as a mechanism in teaching helps children make sense of issues and topics by engaging them in a narrative. It makes facts easier to remember and participants more open to learning.











The name Nina means 'little girl'. Only around one in one thousand Indian stick insects is a male and the females are able to lay fertile eggs without mating.

I love playing and adventure.

Stick Insects have a combination of suckers and claws on their feet, allowing them to walk up vertical surfaces and even upside down.

I like to blend in.

Indian stick insects look almost identical to a stick in shape and colour. At night time they can become slightly darker than by day, helping them to blend in even better with their surroundings.

But I love to dance!

Many species have a rocking motion, where the body sways from side to side, like leaves or twigs swaying in the breeze.







My name means 'beloved'. I'm from the arid, rocky grasslands of Asia.

I'm easy going and friendly.

These little lizards are charming and easy to care for.

But I talk a lot!

Leopard geckos make a squeaking noise when they're happy, but when it's unhappy, scared, or hungry you'll hear a bird-like chirp.

I can adapt to any situation.

A Leopard gecko's tail detaches if it's bitten or caught on something. This allows the animal to get away from danger quickly. The tail also stores fat which can be used as food.

I don't like the outdoors!

Leopard Geckos are not good climbers - other geckos have sticky pads on their feet so they can climb a variety of surfaces, but Leopard Geckos have small claws instead.









We're twins from Madagascar!

Madagascar hissing cockroaches can give birth to as many as 60 babies at a time.

We can be outgoing and loud.

Madagascar hissing cockroaches exhale air through breathing holes on it's body to make a 'hiss' sound. They even have different hisses; one is for male combat, two are for courting and the last is an alarm hiss to ward off predators

We do our part for the environment

They eat anything, from decaying plant material to animal carcasses, and then recycle nutrients back into the ecosystem.

We can be boisterous!

When defending their territory, these cockroaches will hiss, push, shove, and stand on their "toes" to show who's boss. The male that is larger and hisses more usually wins.
